The Elusive Doyle

Do you have an elusive relation? Try looking in unexpected places. Daniel Doyle is the 2nd great-grandfather of my husband. I know of his existence from the marriage certificate of his daughter Alice. On September 13, 1912 she married James Ryan at the Roman Catholic Church of Trinity Without. She lists her father as Daniel Doyle, sailor. She is living on Lower Yellow Road.

I found Alice in the 1911 Irish census living with her mother Bridget and her sister Stasia. Bridget is listed as married, not widowed, so I assumed Daniel was at sea. I try the 1901 census and encounter the same problem.

I sent away for Alice's birth registration for 1894. Daniel is listed as a labourer. I still do not have much to go on as I do not have a birth date for Daniel. Bridget's maiden name appears to be Aspill so I look for a marriage record. The only one I can find is from 1892 of a David Doyle to a Bridget Aspill. Since it is the closest fit I sent for the record but received a transcription instead of a copy of the original. His father is listed as Daniel. She is living at Lower Yellow Road so that seems to fit but is David a transcription error or do I have the wrong record? David/Daniel is living on Morris Road at the time of the marriage.

The tree I was given by my husband's family indicated that Daniel died in 1916; a stoker with the Royal Navy. There is a Daniel Doyle, from Waterford, who died in 1916. His parents are listed as Daniel and Mary; husband to Mary. Further digging indicates that a Bridget Doyle died in 1913 so it is possible that Mary is a second wife.

Out of frustration I typed Daniel Doyle with the residence Waterford into the general search on www.familysearch.org. Daniel Doyle comes up under *Ireland, Prison Registers, 1790-1924*. Yikes.

The 1892 record has a Daniel Doyle, residence Morrison's Road, arrested for being drunk and disorderly. Morris Road = Morrison's Road? I check the 1901 census. There is no Morris Road but there is a Morrison's. I start to lose faith in the accuracy of the transcription for the marriage record. Daniel's birthplace is listed as Parliament St. on the prison record. I filtered for the rest of prison registers for a Daniel Doyle with the birthplace of Parliament St. The earliest record I find is from 1883, age 18. In 1884 he is arrested for being a deserter from 18 Regiment of Foot. The records continue with various arrests for being drunk and disorderly and then in 1895 I find the record for assault of Bridget Doyle.

Everything appears to be adding up for this Daniel Doyle to be the one, though I have nothing concrete. The last prison register record I can find for him is in October 1897; he was arrested for being drunk.

What happened to Daniel Doyle after 1897? Am I even on the right trail?

Possible next steps: order the birth record for Alice's sister Stasia; order the death record for Bridget; write to the Roman Catholic Church of Trinity Without and see if they have other records.
