## Romance at Melrose Café

One of the family stories from my husband's side is that of how his grandparents met during WWII. Katherine worked as a waitress in Vancouver and James was in the Navy. While on shore leave he went to the restaurant where Katherine worked and a romance began. Another piece to the story is that she was a riveter and was the only woman small enough to get into the noses of the planes. Another tidbit from this period is that she built her own house in Vancouver.

I decided to see if I could find evidence to support the story. I have a copy of their 1944 marriage registration so I started there. Katherine's occupation is listed as expeditor in the aircraft industry. That matches up with the story except that Katherine lists her age as 27 instead of 32.

I started with the 1944 city directory on the Vancouver Public Library site. Katherine is living at 1851 E 38<sup>th</sup> Avenue and is an employee of Boeing. Excellent, now I have more details. A search on the City of Vancouver Archives site revealed that Boeing had plants at Georgia Street and Sea Island along with some great images of women in the factory. White jumpsuits and dark head scarfs just like on the TV show *Bomb Girls*.

Moving backwards, the 1943 and 1942 directories list Katherine as a school teacher. However, I hit pay dirt with the 1941 directory. Katherine is listed as a waitress at the Melrose Café. Back to the City of Vancouver Archives site and I found some wonderful images to accompany the story.

Now I needed to tackle the story of her building her own house. The directories show that Katherine lived at 1851 E 38<sup>th</sup> Avenue from 1936-1952 with her parents. Husband James moved in when he returned from the war. By looking under the Vancouver Street names section I can determine that her father was originally the owner. The directories after 1952 are not available yet but by 1959 Katherine, James and her mother were living at 1023 East 21<sup>st</sup> Street according to the death registration for her mother. It seems unlikely that she single-handedly built the house, though

perhaps she did some renovations to accommodate her growing family.

The Vancouver Public Library has a resource guide for how to find information on your Vancouver house so that is a project for another day. For now, I am satisfied that I have found solid evidence and some wonderful images to support two aspects of the story of Katherine and James.
