

Mystery Ring

While going through old family jewelry we came across a gold ring with a jade center that had the following inscribed inside the band: F.F. T.E.Q.C.C. 11952. This was intriguing. I knew that the initials FF was for my husband's grandfather Frank Fulford. He was a longtime Eaton's employee but I wasn't sure what the rest of the inscription was about. Later while I was sorting through a stack of papers and photographs I found my answer.

Among the papers was a certificate which told the whole story. Frank Fulford was enrolled into the Timothy Eaton Quarter Century Club in 1969 for his 25 years of service to the company. The number 11952 was certificate number.

Mole Catching

According to my great uncle George's memoir, his father James and brother Alex had worked through the winter of 1922–1923 digging ditches and trapping moles while living 3 km out of Leslie at Balhauldy, Scotland until it was time to leave for Canada.

Mole catchers were paid for every mole caught as pest control for farmers. They, in turn, sold the moleskins to fur dealers. A pest problem became a lucrative industry when Queen Alexandra, the wife of Edward VII, ordered a mole-fur garment. The Reid family was able to take advantage of this fashion trend.

An article titled "'Moling' for Profit" 14 July 1923 Aberdeen Press and Journal states mole catchers could make up to 10 shillings per skin. Ten skins would be 1£ (about \$87 CDN in today's money) and:

Three men employed on an estate in Hampshire earned over £50 in three or four months last year...
