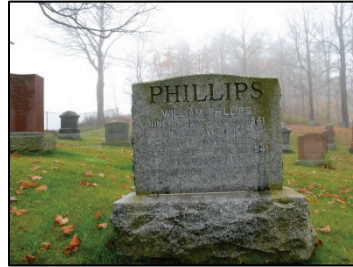

Headstones

It is frustrating when you are researching an ancestor only to get to the point where you just cannot determine when they died. I was searching my husband's 2x great grandfather, John Ayres. I knew through many census records that he was born approximately in 1835. He lived the majority of his life in Burnham Thorpe, Norfolk England so I was confident I was following the correct gentleman. Then the trail went cold. All I could figure out was he died after 1901 and before 1911.

Looking on the England and Wales BMD, I could not narrow it down as to which John Ayres was indeed my John. His wife Ann Maria was also an issue as her name was too common for me to be sure.

I cast out a wider search [I was using Ancestry.com] to see if anything showed up. This proved to be time consuming so I

changed my tactic. I have had success on some fronts looking at headstones from specific cemeteries. Since I had no idea which church, I Googled "Burnham Thorpe Norfolk England cemetery". A few websites showed up. Investigating further I hit the jackpot! I had stumbled on the website

www.gravestonephotos.com. A wonderful volunteer named Jackie Foster had photographed the headstones at All Saint's Church in Burnham Thorpe, Norfolk, England. A quick look up of the surname in question and I had not only a headstone for a John Ayres with the correct approximate birth year but his wife Ann Maria with the correct birth year too was included AND on the bottom a notation of their son Albert Ayres who had died in France in 1917. This was conclusive proof I had the right John Ayres!

This website was started by a gentleman named Charles Sale. He wants to preserve the information on headstones before they are lost due to such things as weathering and vandalism. To date the website has recorded 2660 cemeteries in 35 different countries. The work is donated by volunteers and all photographs are the property of said volunteers or the website. Copyright is straightforward enough for the average person to

understand. Upon requesting a photo, you receive a link to such photo [you used to receive attachments but due to issues the process has changed]. I was thoroughly impressed with the quality! If you care to volunteer, that is also possible.

Of course, this is not the only way to see headstones. Try other websites such as:

Googling the name of the town in question along with the word 'cemetery' might just be fruitful too!

I am looking forward to discovering what other headstones I might find. Apparently they have the cemeteries in Wick, Scotland I need to explore!
